From the new generation of GMOs to the marketing of seeds, Vandana Shiva will deliver her vision of a desirable future, taking care of our Planet and its inhabitants.

Dr. Vandana Shiva has worked on the promotion of sustainable agriculture and biodiversity for over 40 years. She is the founder of the [Navdanya](#) organization, dedicated to the protection of traditional seed varieties and organic agriculture. Simultaneously a teacher, lecturer, writer, activist, environmentalist and feminist, her struggles and successes have led to her recognition as one of the seven most powerful women in the world (*Forbes Magazine*, 2010). In 1993, she received the alternative Nobel Prize "for placing women and ecology at the heart of modern speech".
